

# Report on IPEN – EU Project Meeting in Shenzhen, China

In the framework of the EU-funded project: Strengthening the capacity of pollution victims and civil society organizations to increase chemical safety in China (China Chemical Safety Project)
23 September 2013

The overall objective of this Project is to strengthen the capacity of pollution victims and civil society organization to promote chemical safety policies in China. One of the three principal objectives is to improve capacities and abilities of impacted communities and environmental groups for involvement in policy making. An important activity under this objective is training on public participation in Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) and right to know. The Shenzhen workshop serves as one of three major forums to be held under the Project.

The meeting convened by the Project in Shenzhen focused on EIA with the goal of advancing public participation and true compliance with EIA laws. The meeting included information on China's EIA process, especially on the public participation, responsibilities for project owners, EIA institutes and environmental protection departments. Moreover, it reported on what problems may occur in EIA reports and how civil society can act to ensure compliance with EIA laws.

The main purpose of this meeting was to receive comments from potential users on the guidebook, present key information that the public should know for participation in EIA process, and discuss how people can act to acquire information and ask other stakeholders to take their responsibilities.

# Forum on public participation in environmental impact assessment (EIA): Discussion on Guidebook for EIA Public Participation

In the framework of the EU-funded project: Strengthening the capacity of pollution victims and civil society organizations to increase chemical safety in China (China Chemical Safety Project)

Shenzhen, China 23 September 2013

On 20 June 2013, the First Forum on Public Participation in Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) was held in Beijing jointly by Green Beagle and IPEN in cooperation with Nature University to present problems that usually occur in real-world cases such as lack of effective public participation and rapid approval of EIA reports that could undermine EIA laws. The forum also witnessed differences in focus, method and capacity among NGOs; therefore, more exchange and study in public participation in the EIA process is necessary for NGOs.

To promote authentic public participation and true compliance with the EIA laws, Green Beagle compiled a draft guidebook on NGO/public participation in EIA together with other NGOs and experts to explain what EIA is, what public participation in EIA means, how citizens and NGOs can participate in an EIA process, what types of problems usually occur in EIA process and real cases. The draft was discussed at the Shenzhen Forum.

To involve potential users of the guidebook and receive their comments in the early stage of the writing, Green Beagle and IPEN hosted the second EIA forum in Shenzhen on 23 September 2013. Pollution victims from current case studies of the China Chemical Safety Project came to this workshop including the Qihua PVC Plant in Heilongjiang Province, Union Chemical Plant in Shouguang, Shandong Province, and Likeng Incinerator and Huiyang Incinerator in Guangdong Province. Green Beagle had completed a draft of the guidebook before the meeting and disseminated it to the participants beforehand. Discussion in the meeting focused on the draft and more fresh cases were brought forward by some participants.

Green Beagle and IPEN jointly hosted this forum in cooperation with Nature University. This conference is a project activity of the EU-funded project; *Strengthening the capacity of pollution victims and civil society organizations to increase chemical safety in China (China Chemical Safety Project)*.



### Strengthening the capacity of pollution victims and civil society organizations to increase chemical safety in China

This is an EU-funded project of IPEN with partners Arnika and Green Beagle that aims to strengthen the capacity of civil society organizations and communities impacted by pollution to increase chemical safety in China. The Project (also known as the China Chemical Safety Project) is being implemented in China over two years with total EU funding of €344,580 and EU contribution of 77.84% of the total cost.

#### The Project includes:

- Improving capacities of impacted communities and civil society organizations for involvement in policy making
- Training on public participation in environmental impact assessment
- Generating new publicly available data about pollution and impacted communities that contribute to increased implementation of local and national chemical safety policies
- Raising awareness on emissions-related pollution
